A NOTE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Global Glimpse community,

The past year has been one of great challenge, growth, and achievement. We navigated the devastation of canceling 25 programs in Nicaragua, we crossed a powerful milestone as we served our 5,000th student, and we celebrated the launch of a pivotal partnership with United Airlines. Our successes and the powerful impact of our work this year is a reflection of the tremendous strength of our global community.

Since launching our programs in 2008, Global Glimpse has awarded more than \$10 million dollars in scholarships for students from low-income backgrounds to experience the world outside of the United States. We are driven by a belief that human connection is the foundation for all that is good, real, and important in our world. Global Glimpse uses immersive travel to bring high school students from different ethnic, racial, economic, and cultural backgrounds together and through our programs young people develop empathy, agency, and a global perspective.

In 2018, we served 951 diverse students from 67 high schools. Following the crisis in Nicaragua, we rerouted over 500 students and 50 teachers to new programs in Ecuador and the Dominican Republic. We worked to support our staff and partners in Nicaragua and our team worked tirelessly to ensure that no student missed out on the Global Glimpse experience. Global Glimpse would not exist without Nicaragua. The lessons I learned working to build our first programs there more than ten years ago laid the foundation for everything that we have accomplished as an organization over the past decade.

I am especially grateful this year for the opportunity to continue to grow as a person and a leader at Global Glimpse. I am humbled by the tremendous courage of our students, families, teachers, administrators, donors, international partners, team members, and supporters who stepped up over and over again to make our work possible this year.

OUR WORK

Global Glimpse partners with a diversity of high schools across the country to provide transformative travel and leadership opportunities to students from all socioeconomic backgrounds.

Our program pushes young people to confront a different reality at a young age. Through this challenging and inspiring experience, they gain invaluable perspective on the importance of education and their ability to drive change in their communities and in the world. When you remove students from their neighborhoods and everything that is familiar to them, you give them a new set of eyes and the ability to evaluate not only a wider world, but also the communities they call home. The Global Glimpse program builds empathy, agency, and global perspective and equips students from all backgrounds to succeed in college and drive change locally and globally.



OUR PROGRAM MODEL



1 PRE-TRIP WORKSHOPS

Enrichment programming in our partner schools during the school year establishes foundational knowledge in the areas of youth leadership, globalization, and cultural sensitivity and prepares students for the international immersion experience.

2 INTERNATIONAL IMMERSION

Students then spend 16 days during the summer immersed in daily life in a developing country. The international experience focuses on leadership development, cultural immersion, and service-learning.



3 ALUMNI AMBASSADOR PROGRAM


Following the international immersion experience, students participate in a regionally-focused leadership program. Alumni mentor the next group of students at their school, prepare for college, and gain exposure to a wide range of cross-sector career mentors.

OUR GROWTH

Over the past 11 years, Global Glimpse has served 5,600 students and 500 educators across 67 high schools in the San Francisco Bay Area, New York, Chicago, and Massachusetts and six national college preparatory organizations.

Founded in 2007, we launched our first programs in partnership with 10 low-income high schools in the San Francisco Bay Area. Since then, we have grown more than tenfold, expanding in the Bay Area and successfully launching regional programs in New York (2013), Chicago (2015), and Massachusetts (2017).

2018 PROGRAMS

Global Glimpse is more than travel. We work to prepare our students intellectually and emotionally for a transformative international experience. Accepted students participate in eight pre-trip workshops that prepare them to engage in deeper learning during the summer immersion program. We also provide follow-on alumni programming to ensure that their learning returns to their schools and home communities.



OUR STUDENTS

Our students represent the economic, racial, ethnic, and cultural diversity of each of our partner high school communities. We provide need-based scholarships to all students on a sliding scale, taking into account family income and the number of dependents in their household. Full scholarships are awarded to students with family incomes under \$40,000, and students with family incomes under \$60,000 are classified as low-income.


INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM

Global Glimpse gives a face to poverty, a voice to history, a vision and a story to development. We open a window into another world for students while constantly tying their experience back to their lives in the United States. During the summer, our students spend 16 days immersed in daily life in a developing country. The international program centers around cultural immersion, leadership development, and service learning. Students travel in diverse groups of approximately 20 and each delegation is supported by two U.S. educators and two international program staff.

Our international staff work closely with local community partners to develop highly structured programs that allow students to explore a range of topics through the lenses of history, culture, politics, poverty, education, development, and business. Students also tutor local youth in English throughout their trip and participate in a "Community Action Project" (CAP), a student-designed project developed and executed in partnership with a local community organization.

The Dominican Republic (DR) is an island nation and one of the Caribbean's most geographically diverse countries with energetic people and a vibrant, music-filled culture. We began working in the DR in 2013 and our programs have quickly expanded to three cities. Our DR programs engage bilingual Dominican youth to help build experiential learning experiences for our U.S. students. These Dominican youth also support our students to teach English classes for local community members.

Programs in the DR provide students with perspective on education, global business, politics, history, and culture with a special focus on migration and inequality. Students are exposed to the complex relations between Haiti and the DR, as well as the impact that high immigration rates to the U.S. has on the economy and social life in the DR.

Sitting on the equator between Colombia and Peru, Ecuador boasts breathtaking scenery, biodiversity, a strong indigenous presence, beautiful artisan crafts, and bustling markets. We launched our programs in Ecuador in 2015. Our diverse sites in the Andean highlands expose students to the high-stakes interplay between environmental preservation, economic development, and indigenous worldviews.

Our Ecuador programs have a strong focus on indigenous rights, along with history, culture, global business, and education. Students grapple with the positive and negative implications of economic progress and its impact on indigenous communities and the environment.

Since launching our programs in 2008, we have sent 3,240 students and hundreds of educators to program sites across Nicaragua. The spirit of Nicaragua permeates our culture and programming across the San Francisco Bay Area, New York, Chicago, Massachusetts, Ecuador, and the Dominican Republic.

We made the difficult decision to withdraw our programs in Nicaragua in 2018, following civil unrest in the country and we worked to support our staff and partners, whose lives have been deeply impacted by the crisis.

Global Glimpse was born in Nicaragua and our hearts break for the young people who sacrificed their lives fighting for justice, human rights, and democracy in Nicaragua this year and the families and communities that will never be the same. Nicaraguans have overcome injustice countless times before. Fear breeds greater division, and just as we commit to building bridges across international divides, we also commit to keeping these bridges strong when they are most threatened.

ALUMNI AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

Students return from their international experience inspired and motivated to give back to their local communities. We provide our alumni with a follow-on program that supports them to take on leadership roles in their schools and prepare for college and careers.

Through six inspiring alumni summits, our alumni are empowered to be ambassadors for the Global Glimpse program at their school, recruit the next class of Glimpsers, and facilitate pre-trip workshops. They also receive college and career guidance from a network of cross-sector professional mentors.

OUR IMPACT

Through our program, students develop a deep sense of personal and social responsibility and the empathy, agency, and perspective they need to succeed in college and careers and drive positive change in their communities.

We diligently evaluate the impact of all of our programming on students, parents, educators, and community partners. We incorporate feedback and learning from annual post-program and alumni surveys to improve each component of our program. Our surveys evaluate short-term outcomes in participants' awareness, agency, and engagement as well as long-term outcomes in global competence, college persistence, and leadership.

As we prepare for more significant growth, we are increasing our focus on alumni engagement and measuring the long-term impact of our programs.

STUDENT IMPACT

Global Glimpse builds awareness, agency, and engagement and through our programs, students realize their potential to drive positive change. We empower students to develop the skills they need to think critically, take on leadership roles in their schools and communities, and build strong connections with people from very different backgrounds.



TEACHER IMPACT

Global Glimpse Leaders (GGLs) are teachers who champion the Global Glimpse program at our partner high schools. We provide comprehensive training and ongoing support for GGLs to lead our pre-trip workshop curriculum and travel with students on the international summer immersion program. Since 2008, we have trained and supported over 500 GGLs to become more effective educators.

Students understand the relationship between oneself and others, as well as issues of local and global concern. They are inspired to expand their global awareness and develop a sense of compassion for others.




